HISTORY & PHYSICAL

CHIEF COMPLAINT & PRESENT ILLNESS: The patient is a 37-year-old, white female, who complains of tightness in the throat and slight shortness of breath, pain in the posterior aspect of the neck, pain in the right upper quadrant of the abdomen, backache - especially during the night - and abdominal distention.

The patient was in good health until July 1984, when she developed abdominal pain and was diagnosed with Stage IV non-Hodgkin's lymphoma with massive intra-abdominal involvement and involvement of the bone marrow. The patient did not have any conventional treatment for her condition, and was taking only dietary approach - vitamins and minerals, including selenium. She did relatively well, but had slow progression of the disease.

PAST HISTORY: She had resection of a benign ovarian cyst in 1972.

ALLERGIES: She is ALLERGIC to PENICILLIN (rash) and to RAGWEED.

HABITS: She used to smoke one pack of cigarettes daily, between the ages of 17 to 25.

FAMILY HISTORY: Non-contributory for cancer.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

GENERAL: A 37-year-old, white female, pleasant and cooperative.

HEAD: Symmetrical.

EYES: With sclerae white and pupils round and equal, reacting to the light.

MOUTH: In decent state. Throat not injected. Tonque in the midline.

NOSE: Nostrils are open. No discharge is seen.

EARS: Within normal limits.

NECK: Symmetrical. Trachea in the midline. Thyroid gland not enlarged. Veins not distended.

The patient has a small lymph node palpable in the left suboccipital area which measures approximately 1.2 x 0.8 cm and another lymph node in the right supraclavicular area measuring approximately 1.0 x 0.6 cm. Both lymph nodes are non-tender, are moveable and firm, and the overlying skin is unchanged.

CHEST: Clear to auscultation and percussion.

HEART: Within normal limits. Heart rate 72 per minute; rhythm regular.

No murmurs are heard.

BREASTS: Normal female. No masses are felt.

ABDOMEN: Distended. No masses and no enlarged organs are felt.

EXTREMITIES: Within normal limits.

PERIPHERAL LYMPH NODES: As described above.

NEUROLOGIC: Within normal limits.
